2nd Quarter Meeting Minutes (Unofficial)
Board of Directors and Executive Board
February 9, 2019

Call to Order- Governor Jean Smith at 9:10 a.m.

Invocation was given by Lt. Governor Ellen Thompson

Reading of the Minutes and Financial Report- Motion to accept was made by Coach Roe Williams; seconded by Bill Redwine; motion carried

Ed Smith presented the Revised Proposed Budget for the year 2018-19. After a lengthy discussion of several items of the revised Budget, a motion to approve was made by Gene Blanchett; seconded by Coach Roe Williams; motion carried, therefore the revised Budget was approved.

Those present were then divided into Zones to elect a Lt. Governor for the year 2019-20.

Governor Jean passed around cards for either sick members of our District or for the families of deceased members.

#### **Committee Reports:**

- 1. Leadership Development-Ramona Allen-Ramsey. Ramona stated that, "Every person in the room has shown they have leadership because they are here today." Any questions about Leadership, talk to her. Together Everybody Achieves More! Go TEAM!
- 2. Membership- Beth Kerns. M & M's. More Members! Beth mentioned that Gov. Jean will reimburse the \$15 to any club for each new member. Beth reported that our District was 3rd in the Americas Districts. She suggested that clubs go to the Mayor of your town and ask him to join or to name someone that could join from his administration.
- 3. New Club Building- Ed Smith. Ed promoted the Club Within a Club idea. Then Gov. Jean presented the members of the new club in attendance, Elizabethtown Optimist Club, District pins.
- 4. Club Fitness- Tom Birch."Dutch" read a quote from John Wayne that had he known he'd get an Academy Award for

wearing an eye patch, he would have put one on sooner! Tom stated that we need to "patch" our club's membership! Tom mentioned that on page 10 of the Winter Optimist International magazine there is a list of awards for getting new members.

- 5. PGI- Mayghin Levine. Mayghin handed out PGI Passports to those that wanted them, then went over the requirements for Level I. Most of the attendees will have completed at least Level I by the time they were through the District Meeting. They just have to have their Club Secretary/Treasurer to certify it by signing the bottom of the page for Level I. Each Level has certain tasks and as they are completed and verified, then that person can get a colored disk to wear behind their Optimist pin to show the Level completed.
- 6. Essay Contest- Bill Rybak. Bill reminded everyone that the Essay winner from their club needs to be to him by February 28th. Mail to 4021 Landside Dr., Louisville, KY 40220.
- 7. Oratorical Contest- Sandy Goodlett. The deadline to send in an application to the District contest is April 2nd. She suggested that if you are only sponsoring a student and not having a contest, please have that student present their speech at a club meeting. Have a few members critique the speech so that student has good feedback before actually giving the speech at the District contest. Be sure to give Participation Certificates at the Club level. You can download from the OI.
- 8. CCDHH- Beth Kerns. Beth is trying to get some students to participate. Gov. Jean is talking to a school in the Louisville area. District contest is the Saturday, May 11.
- 9. Tri-Star Basketball- Stuart Maiden. Stuart reported that the Tri-Star Basketball Contest would be on March 2, 2019. The age categories will be from age 8-13, as of March 15. Fees- \$20/participant; 4 or more from any one club will be \$80.00 max. There will also be a "Shootout" again after the regular Tri-Star event. He mentioned that only 1st and 2nd place trophies will be given out.
- 10. Junior Golf- Stuart Maiden, Junior Golf will be held on June 10th starting at 9 a.m. tee time at London Country Club. Deadline is June 3rd. Hole Sponsor will again be \$50.00. He reminded clubs that they can sponsor a local student without having to hold a local tournament.

- 14. 3rd Quarter District meeting- Ed Smith. Ed handed out registration packets for the 3rd Quarter meeting in Louisville, May 10-12. The main activity on Friday is going for a day at Churchill Downs. The cost includes a buffet lunch, entrance to the Downs and a Race Book. He said that he had only 19 tickets left. However, can get another table of 8 reserved if enough people want to go. The Louisville Club is hosting this meeting. They are also going to the Downs the Tuesday of Derby Week, April 30. 
