T h Candidate Qualifications Committee responsible for receiving name qualificaand tions for prospective candidates for the office of

Governor-Elect by July 1, 2019. Candidates shall provide the following prior to the annual convention:

- a. A written presentation on the background and qualifications for office.
- b. A letter from the candidate's Club indicating its support of the candidacy.
- c. A written statement from the candidate's employer indicating an underand approval of the commitment of time necessary while in office. Candidates who are selfemployed shall submit this statement on their own behalf.

The Candidate Qualifications Committee shall prepare and distribute a summary of the qualifications and background of each nominee to each Club prior to the convention.

In the event of a floor nomination, it shall be the responsibility of the Committee to verify that the nominee meets the qualifications for office as outlined in the Optimist International Bylaws.

THE DISTRICT NEEDS YOU

I am currently looking for Lieutenant Governors for Zone 4 and Zone 5. To be qualified to be a Lieutenant Governor you must have served as President at your club. Most find this position the most rewarding officer position in Optimists.

Each Lieutenant Governor shall function as a representative of Optimist International and the Governor in his assigned Zone, and generally conduct his office in a manner contributory to the attainment of all objectives of the District and Optimist International within each Zone. The Lieutenant Governor must make every attempt to visit each newly affiliated Club in his Zone within 90 days following its official organization. He shall make the prescribed report of each visitation within 30 days. Each Lieutenant Governor should schedule and conduct meetings in the Zone at least quarterly. Notice shall be given to the Zone Club Presidents and Club Secretary-Treasurers at least 15 days prior to such meeting. He shall make the prescribed report of each meeting within 30 days of the meeting date.

Call to Order- Governor Jean Smith at 9:10 a.m.

Invocation was given by Wayne Dunn Pledge to the Flag was led by Wayne Dunn

Reading of the Minutes and Financial Report- Motion to accept was made by Judy Ziegler; seconded by Harold Brussell; motion carried

The Zone report for the elected Lt. Governors were updated:

- 1. None
- 2. Mayghin Levine
- 3. Harold Brussell
- 4. Judy Ziegler
- 5. None
- 6. Tom Birch

Those present were then divided into Zones- Current Lt. Governor to hold meetings

Governor Jean reminded everyone that their Officer Election report is to May 20th to OI.

Committee Reports:

- 1. Leadership Development-Ramona Allen-Ramsey. Ramona encouraged each person in your club to become a leader- you can always serve in one way or another.
- 2. Membership- Beth Kerns. Beth stated, "Treat each club member as GOLD because they are. Find out what each member's talents are and use that someplace in your club." As a District, we had 47 members deleted and added 49 for a plus 5. We are leading in our Region. Remember that younger members have newer ideas, etc to make the club strong. Please post pictures, etc on Face Book. Remember to post names with the pictures.
- 3. New Club Building- Ed Smith. Ed showed banner patches for building a new club. If anyone knows anyone in the Lexington area, let Ed know as a new club is being built there. Any interest in building a club in another area, let him know. President Rebecca Butler Mona also suggested these options for new clubs:
 - a. On-line clubs
- b. College Clubs (dues on a different scale)
 - c. Homecoming- \$30 per first year

- 4. Club Fitness- Tom"Dutch" Birch. Tom reminded us that we need to protect the members we have. Remember the Little Dutch Boy!
- 5. PGI- Mayghin Levine. Mayghin handed out PGI Passports to those that wanted them, and then went over the requirements for Level II Bronze and Level III Green.
- 6. Tri-Star Basketball- Stuart Maiden. Stuart reported that the Cost for pizza and trophies was \$253.00. Entry fees and a donation by the London Laurel Club paid for all the items. There were a total of 18 kids and they each were given a tee shirt and a trophy. In addition to the regular Tri-Star, there were 5 spots on the court for a Shoot Out contest to name a King and Oueen of the Court.
- 7. Essay Contest- Bill Rybak. Bill reported that there were 10 clubs that participated in the Essay Contest. He suggested clubs look on-line for "how to's" for next year.
- 8. Oratorical Contest- Sandy Goodlett. She reported that 12 clubs are participating, with one entrant that can't make this contest, so, only one session will be used. There will be a Guest sign in sheet for parents, etc.
- 9. Junior Golf- Stuart Maiden. Junior Golf will be held on June 10th starting at 9 a.m. tee time at London Country Club. Deadline is June 3rd. This is for 10-18 year olds. \$60.00 will sponsor a child. Hole Sponsor will again be \$50.00. Participants can "Play Up" a level, if desired. He reminded clubs that they can sponsor a local student without having to hold a local tournament.
- 10. Childhood Health & Wellness-Frances Lee. Reporting for Frances was Governor Jean. At the February meeting, \$1,050 was collected for CHW. A check from Catlettsburg for \$1,000 was received.
- 11. OI Foundation- Harold Brussell. Harold reported he had the "Dime A Day" pins and that a District member had bought pins to be presented to the first, second and third place winners at today's Oratorical Contest. He presented Tom Birch a pin for his contributions to the Foundation totaling \$5,000. A Print was presented to Frank and Susan Ruman.
- 12. OI Convention- Judy Ziegler. Judy reminded everyone that the International Convention was June 29- July 3 in Louisville, Ky.
- A. She wanted everyone to Register to attend; Volunteer to help with different area of the Convention and to Donate from

- each club. Donations received by May 27th will be recognized in the program. Total of donations stand at \$13,000. Morehead has donated \$1,000. Louisville has donated \$3,000-5,000 for the Old Timer's Breakfast and a Hospitality Room on Sunday night, June 30th.
- B. Wayne Dunn reported that on Saturday, June 29th there will be a Ceremonial Centennial Walk/Parade from the Galt House to 4 weeks away to a Historical Site Marker placed where the First Convention was held. If you want to help with this, call Wayne.

Morehead honors local Deputy for service

The Morehead Optimist Club recognized Deputy James Damron as part of the annual Respect for Law program sponsored by Optimist International. Deputy Damron has provided untold services throughout Rowan County as part of his everyday routine for more than 32 years. Retiring from the Sheriff's Department five (5) years ago, Deputy Damron was lured out of retirement by current Sheriff Matt Sparks to work part-time to supplement the Department.

"It didn't take me long to see that James may have been hired as a part-time Deputy, but he puts in full-time hours most weeks because of his commitment to the citizens of Rowan County," said Sheriff Sparks, who went on to say, "we're not sure when exactly James sleeps as he is always ready and willing to assist other Deputies when called on." While the mission of the Optimist Club is to support youth pro-



grams in the community, the recognition of law enforcement as part of Respect for Law is paramount in developing the youth. "We believe it is important for children to grow up with a strong belief in abiding by the law, respecting law enforcement and doing what they can to maintain peace," Club President Bill Redwine said. that our recognition of Deputy Damron will help in this effort," Redwine added. The Morehead Optimist Club will make a \$250 monetary donation in honor of Deputy Damron to the Kentucky Sheriffs' Boys and Girls Ranch, the charity of his choice.

In 1965, a new program was undertaken to combat apathy toward crime and the dispensation of justice. With the cooperation of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, with former Director J. Edgar Hoover taking the lead and the Royal Canadian Mounted Police,

Optimist International began Respect for Law Week. One of the more visual aspects of this program is the Optimist International Respect for Law Citation, which recognizes citizens for outstanding service at a crime scene by aiding police. This is the fourth most popular Optimist activity with more than 1,500 clubs participating each year.

The Morehead Optimist Club has been participating in Respect for Law for many years and has been active in the Morehead community since 1964. Other programs and service projects that the Club is involved in include an oratorical contest, an essay contest, Tri-Star basketball skills, youth golf and

sponsorship of a host of other youth activities through charitable bingo.

Optimist International is one of the world's largest service club organizations with over 80,000 adult and youth members in almost 3,000 clubs in the United States, Canada, the Caribbean and Mexico and throughout the world.
